

NOTICE OF COMPLETION

Broadview and Eastern Flood Protection Municipal Class Environmental Assessment - Schedule C

Toronto and Region Conservation Authority (TRCA), in conjunction with the City of Toronto and Waterfront Toronto, have completed the Broadview and Eastern Flood Protection Municipal Class Environmental Assessment, Schedule C (Class EA). The study was carried out following the requirements for and in accordance with Schedule C projects under the Municipal Class EA process.

Project Background

The primary objective of this Municipal Class EA was to identify a flood protection solution for an 8-hectare parcel of urban land near the intersection of Broadview Avenue and Eastern Avenue, north of the Metrolinx railway corridor, east of the Don River (project area). This study built upon the outcomes of the Don Mouth Naturalization and Port Lands Flood Protection Project, and the Port Lands and South of Eastern Transportation and Servicing Master Plan, to address the project area that remains at risk to flooding under the Regional Storm.

The final Environmental Study Report (ESR) is being released for a 30-day public and agency review and comment period from April 13 to May 12, 2021. In addition, a Part II Order request may be made to the Ministry of the Environment, Conservation and Parks for an order requiring a higher level of study (i.e., requiring an individual/comprehensive EA approval before being able to proceed), or that conditions be imposed (e.g., require further studies), only on the grounds that the requested order may prevent, mitigate, or remedy adverse impacts on constitutionally protected Aboriginal and treaty rights. Requests on other grounds will not be considered. Requests should include the requester contact information and full name for the ministry.

Requests should specify what kind of order is being requested (request for additional conditions or a request for an individual/ comprehensive environmental assessment), how an order may prevent, mitigate, or remedy those potential adverse impacts, and any information in support of the statements in the request. This will ensure that the ministry is able to efficiently begin reviewing the request. 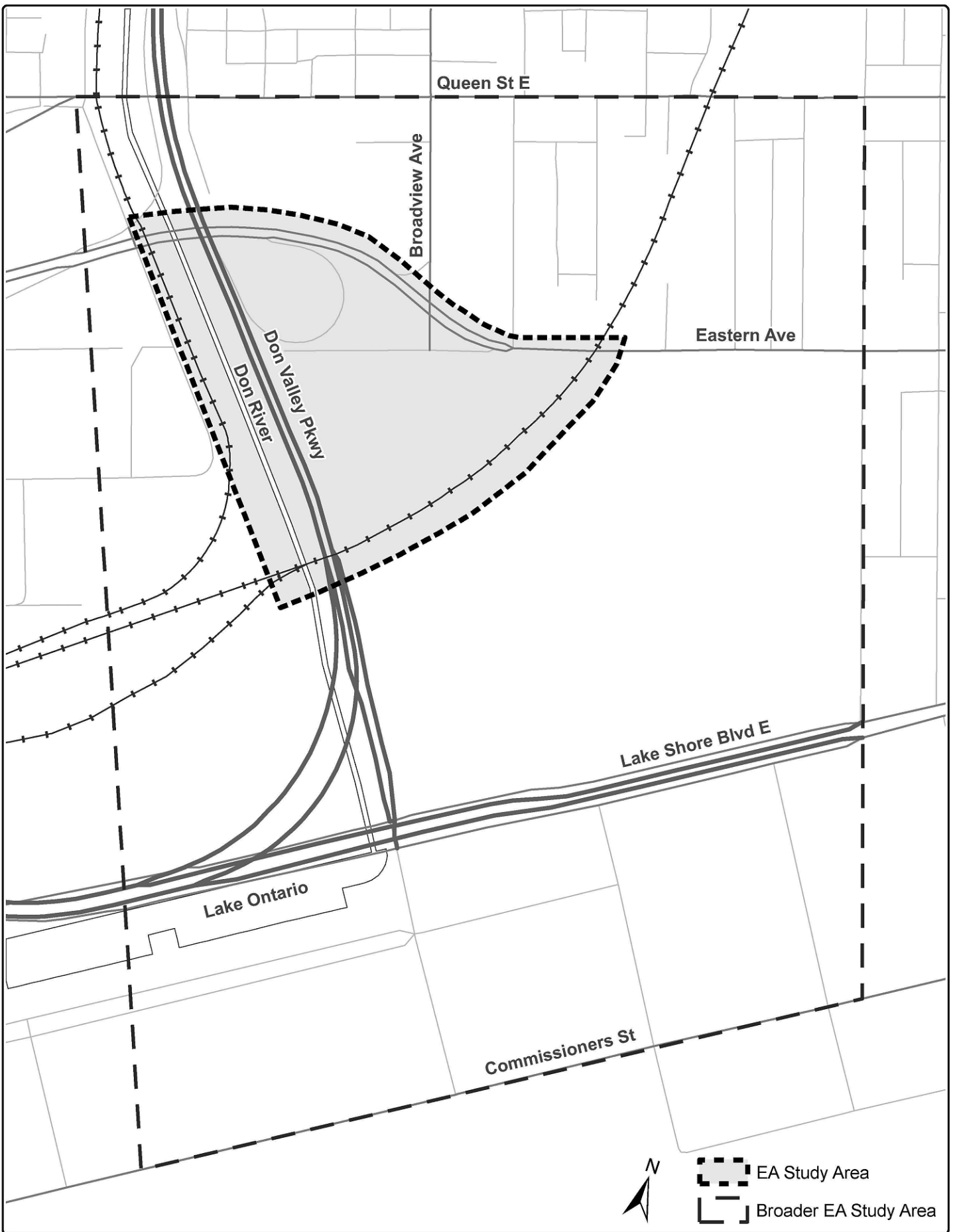
